
# GRAND OLE OPRY WEEKEND A SUCCESS!


#### GRAND OLE OPRY WEEKEND CONT'D.


# V P ELECTION/ MEMBERSHIP RELIGIOUS EXPERIANCES


# NOW SET



# HOTELS SET

It's coming... faster than you think...
IGRA's Annual Final's Rodeo, this year to be held in Wichita Kansas, Oct. 18,19, and 20th.
A number of our Contestants are in good standing to recieve invitations to this event.
You'll all want to go up and cheer them on.
Also on-tap is the Mr/Ms/Miss IGRA Royalty
Contest, as well as the IGRA Dance Champion-ship, so we'll have plenty of people up there needing our support.

We bring this event to your attention earlier than we normally would, due to possible problems with booking rooms up there. We know how you are ... you're going to wait until the last minute, and then want to call the Hotel(s) and book yourself a room the day before you fly out. It won't work that way this time kids, you'll end up being street people. ALL room requests at ANY of the three Host Hotels MUST go through something called their "Housing Bureau". We're not sure why it worked out this way, except maybe that their Housing Bureau is part of their Chamber of Commerce, which wants to keep track of how many dollars different events bring into Wichita. At any rate, doesn't matter why it's set-up like this, it is, and you're now stuck actually having to plan your trip more than a month in advance. Doesn't it just rank you?!

Here's how it works... You CAN'T contact the Hotels directly, nor can you call their Housing Bureau. All requests for rooms must be in writing, by filling out a form that's part of the Final's tri-fold. Copies of the tri-fold are acceptable. If you don't have one, contact Jeff Coon, our Mobility & Logistics person, or give me a call (Tim @ #892-1183) and I'll send one out to ya. Will also have copies available at our next Membership meeting. These forms must be sent up to them BEFORE Sept., 15th, requesting your preferences for the three Hotels. Then the Hotel where you've been placed (not necessarily your first choice, depending on how late you get to this) will send you a confirmation. If you don't provide credit card information on your original room request, then you must send a check (for the first night) up to the Hotel where you've been placed after you recieve their confirmation.

Can you see the planning needed here?
No more deciding who's rooming with who on
the trip up. Everyone needs to be booked
(with names) in advance. If you don't get on
this, don't plan on sharing your wardrobe
with your buddy in the room down the hall,
cause he/she may be down the hall in another
Hotel!

Don't know if it's strictly legal, but we're kinda thinking about sending up groups of requests together, asking that if one of us needs to get bumped to another Hotel, that the entire group get bumped, so we can all still be together. Perhaps you need to get on the phone with your own "group" and plan on doing the same? More Final's details in later issues, now book those rooms!

#### SHANTI IS NEW FOOD DRIVE FOCUS

We've got a new, more directed, focus for our ongoing food drive project that we're hoping will get your creative juices going a little.

Since Woody first proposed this project, we've discovered that there's only a couple of AIDS service groups in town who have the capabilities of handling food, and one of those, Shanti, has an immense need for it. Shanti also provides us with a creative challenge.

When we talked to Sharon Morgan (who runs their kitchen operations) we learned that she was straining to prepare five meals per day for a near capacity client load of 20 people. Upcoming expansion will eventually take Shanti up to 90 beds, all of them needing 3 major, and 2 snack meals per day, and all on a severely limited budget.

Dollar amounts, per day, per client, fluctuate due to a number of factors, but suffice to say that what Sharon gets to supply 5 meals per person each day, is probably what we'd spend on ourselves for one dinner. Needless to say, that can mean pretty basic food fare. And that's a shame, as the majority of Shanti's clients have no diet restrictions. On one end of the scale, Sharon informs us that they never have enough soups in stock, but the other extreme applies as well, with other clients requesting that more hot sauce be put in those enchiladas! Shanti strives to meet each individual client's wants, and that's where we can help. The more non-perishable basics we provide, the more food dollars we free up so that Shanti can afford more fresh foods, and those extras that their client's request.

The next time you're shopping, remember, a can of soup is great, but so is the even more basic bag of flour, jar of spices, or a package of pasta.

If several of you are coming in to the Membership meeting together, remember to hit the store first, and go together on some theme. Do tacos for instance, bring in the mix, shells, a can of black olives, and don't forget the hot sauce!

Be creative, make it fun, and remember, if you don't already have friends in Shanti right now, you probably will have in the future. Help us give more pleasant meal-times to those friends.
