In the week leading up to this year's rodeo, there was a serious question in my mind whether it would come to fruition. The most serious threat came in the form of the EHV-1 equine virus and the possible loss of contestants as a result for fear of exposing their animals to this potentially lethal virus. This was the first time of such a serious threat of this virus affecting IGRA sanctioned rodeos. Also of concern to a lesser degree was the scheduled rodeo announcer having to back out 2 weeks prior to rodeo for personal reasons, the high price of diesel and gas, tornadoes earlier in the week, countless emails and calls from contestants. I began to joke with other members that the only thing left was a swarm of locusts! Despite all, the 2011 Great Plains Rodeo proceeded as scheduled. Thanks to the help of many dedicated volunteers, the rodeo was successful and IGRA assessed no fines. There were many compliments which were truly appreciated!

This year also brought a new rodeo stock contractor. Willie Williams of Williams Ranch Rodeo, located out of Jones, OK, impressed everyone with his first IGRA sanctioned rodeo performance. He brought quality stock, an excellent crew, composed mostly of his own family, who worked very hard all weekend. In particular his junior bulls were very much on point for IGRA's new stock specification for the new to this year's circuit, junior bulls event which replaced steer riding.

The 27th production of the Great Plains Rodeo for 2012 is already facing it's own threats! The Pride Committee for OKC Pride tried to move pride weekend to Memorial Day weekend which has traditionally been rodeo weekend in OKC. The 2012 pride weekend will be held the weekend BEFORE our rodeo. Speculation is that they are still determined to move their event to Memorial Day weekend.

The consequences of pride being the weekend before or worse the same weekend as the Great Plains Rodeo are vet to be known. It is most likely that the result will be harmful unless we can use it to our benefit. Another large threat is apathy from the membership. OGRA and the Great Plains Rodeo have a long and proud tradition both in our local community and the larger IGRA rodeo community and circuit. It would be a tragic event if we were unable to produce the Great Plains Rodeo! We are one of the longest running rodeos on the IGRA circuit. Please get involved and help ensure that OGRA and the Great Plains Rodeo will be around for another 25 years and longer!

COWBOY COOKIE RECIPE

Ingredients

- 1 cup shortening (recommended: Crisco)
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 2 cups rolled oats
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1 (6-ounce) package chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup shredded coconut

Directions


Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

In a large bowl, with an electric mixer, cream the shortening, granulated sugar, and brown sugar. Add eggs and the vanilla and beat until well blended. Stir in the flour, baking soda, salt, and baking powder. Add oats, nuts, chocolate chips and coconut, mix until combined. Spoon cookie mixture onto greased foil lined cookie sheet. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes. Transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool.
