

The Annual Convention and Meeting of Members will be held at Buffalo Bills, Stateline, NV. (near Las Vegas). The dates will be April 19th and 20th, 1997. Registration will be \$35.00 per person in advance and \$50.00 at the door and will include, Coffee Socials, Lunch on Saturday, Seminars and attendance in daily membership meetings. Business that will come before the Convention will include review of our Standing Rules and Bylaws, reports from Standing and Ad Hoc Committees and election of Officers. 




