



Special International Awards

It's time to begin the nominations process for International awards for 2002. Voting for all awards recipients will occur at the board and trustees meetings in Los Angeles on Friday, April 19, 2002. Three of the awards are designated for members of I.G.R.A. These awards are:

<u>DIRECTORS AWARD:</u> for contributions made in any of I.G.R.A.'s many activities. *I.G.R.A. pays for a maximum of five awards.*

INTERNATIONAL AWARD: for significant accomplishment that is not part of "some organized competition which offers recognition in the form of awards". I.G.R.A. pays for a maximum of five awards.

TRUSTEES AWARD: for those who have exhibited excellence in the standards exemplified in the Code of Ethics and Sportsmanship. *I.G.R.A.* pays for a maximum of five awards.

One award is for non-members of I.G.R.A. This award is:

APPRECIATION AWARD: for significant contributions to the International Association and is a means of providing a formal "thank you". This award may be given by the Officers, Directors, Trustees, Committee Chairs, or other official representatives of International with the approval of the Board of Directors. I.G.R.A. pays for a maximum of two awards per Member Association.

The I.G.R.A. Board of Directors votes on recipients for the Directors, International, and Appreciation Awards, and the Trustees vote on recipients for the Trustees Award.

In order to make the nomination process more efficient, the following guidelines apply:

(1) I have to Submit all nominations to Ron Trusley in writing by MONDAY, APRIL 1, 2002. Include the name of the nominee, Association where the nominee is a member, and a brief description of why you are making the nomination

(2) Additional nominations **MAY** be received at the April 19 meetings.

2001 - 2002 Variances

Listed below are variances that have been approved by the Trustees for this rodeo year (November 1, 2001 through October 31, 2002).

HEARTLAND RODEO JUNE 28-30, 2002:

Arena size of 95 feet X 175 feet.

CANADIAN ROCKIES INTL RODEO JUNE 28-30, 2002:

Use cows instead of steers in the steer riding event.

KGRA FINALS 2002 OCTOBER 10-13, 2002:

Arena width of 99 feet.

Rule interpretations

Rule interpretations made by the Trustees for the current rodeo year include:

RODEO RULE IX, SECTION 37:

The Trustees have interpreted the third sentence in this rule to mean: "Prior to the start of horse speed events, the Arena Director will designate any portion of the runway that will be included as part of the

arena. The Arena Director will be responsible for posting with the running order the designated runway and have it announced over the P.A. system before the running of the first speed event." (Interpretation at January 18, 2002 meeting)

There is one other Rule interpretation about key personnel being in exhibition performance / fund raiser. There is some questions about the interpretation that was sent out from Ron Trusley I.G.R.A. Secretary. Charley Lanier IGRA Trustee's Chairman is working on it and as soon as I get a update on it I will forward it to you.

IT WAS GREATLY APPRECIATED. NOW DOWN TO BUSINESS. THE TWO BIGGEST EVENTS WERE THE NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS OF IGRA DELEGATES, AND THE NOMINATIONS FOR THE NEW GSGRA EXECUTIVE BOARD. 

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
