Have you ever wondered what IGRA as an organization or charity does, or what it does for your Association? How about where does the money go? In recent months, I've heard chatter regarding these subjects and it became apparent that maybe a lot of us have lost focus on what this organization is, does, and who we are.

With any organization, it takes fuel to push the ship forward. This 'fuel' relates to money and people. And it takes a lot of both!!! For the purpose of this article, we are specifically talking about IGRA, the mothership.

There are countless numbers of volunteers for IGRA's World Gay Rodeo Finals. There are countless hours put in by IGRA Royalty working and raising money. And just where does it all go or what is it used for? The International Gay Rodeo Association (IGRA) is not just an umbrella name over the local Associations. I've spoken with several that manage the administration of IGRA and here's a list of how this all works:

- IGRA pays for and manages the Online Registration System
- IGRA administers the Certification Program which provides Certified Officials for the rodeos
- IGRA pays for the Auditor travel to each rodeo
- IGRA administers the insurance (local Associations pay their part into the premium)

- IGRA pays for and produces WGRF
- IGRA hosts Convention and covers cost of conference rooms
- IGRA hosts University and covers cost of conference rooms
- IGRA pays for the D&O Insurance this is insurance to cover the Board of Directors in the event of a lawsuit
- IGRA subsidizes rodeo schools \$500 per
- IGRA maintains and covers the cost to print the rule book

All of the above are factors that filter down to all of the local Associations, which enables them to produce their own rodeos and raise money for their charities. When it comes to our Mission Statement, IGRA does more than promote the country/western lifestyle and/or provide a safe space for LGBTQ+ community. Along with that, IGRA provides the education with the above factors to do what we all love. This rodeo organization is not about one group specifically. It takes Royalty to raise funds and be the embassadors in the public. It takes arena crew, Certified Officials, Contestants, Volunteers. Basically, it takes all of us to run the ship and keep it moving forward. Take out one aspect and the ship stops. Please don't ever think what you are doing does not go unrecognized or unrewarded. You are needed. We all do this together.
