

NGRA needs to work on raising funds to help cover our support with World Finals, along with working on raising money for BigHorn Rodeo 14.

Now that it's July, it's time to start looking ahead to the end of my 3-year term as your Trustee. I can't believe the time has gone by so quickly. It has been a huge honor for me to serve as your representative with IGRA these three years. Serving at the IGRA level has allowed me to make many new friends and I hope I have been able to bring benefits to NGRA through my efforts in this position. The NGRA Board is currently soliciting candidates for NGRA Trustee 2011-2013.

NGRA Bylaws dictate the following process for the election of the Trustee: Ballots shall be mailed or posted online in a secure manner every third $\binom{3}{7}$ year immediately after the August general membership meeting and must be received by the Board of Directors no later than the September general membership meeting.

IGRA Bylaws state that the Trustee term of office shall be three (3) years. Election shall be by the respective Member Association in accordance with its bylaws or rules and all Trustees shall assume office on January 1.

In addition to local Board duties as proscribed by NGRA Bylaws, the NGRA Trustee serves on the **IGRA Board of Directors** which has fiduciary responsibility for International. It approves contracts and negotiations with external entities and resolves any disputes between member associations. The BOD manages most of the business operations of the organization.

The NGRA Trustee also serves on the **IGRA Board of Trustees.** The trustees are responsible for interpretation and administration of all Rodeo, Dance, and Royalty Competition Rules. The BOT is also the responsible for review and approval of variances and date changes for all rodeos, and oversight and ruling on matters of conduct for competitors and officials.

Any disputes arising over interpretation of the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, Resolutions of the Annual Convention, Resolutions of the Board of Directors, Resolutions of the Trustees, Standing Rules and Procedures, Code of Ethics and Sportsmanship, and Rules of Sanctioned Rodeos are resolved by the Trustees.

The list below includes most of the specific duties and responsibilities potential candidates should be aware of:

- Attend the four quarterly IGRA Board of Directors meetings and the four quarterly Board of Trustees meetings plus the World Gay Rodeo Finals as Trustee.
- At rodeos attend the pre-rodeo and post-rodeo review meetings.
- Write a Trustee's article for the NGRA Newsletter each month.
- Attend the NGRA BOD and GMM Meetings each month.
- Strive to provide NGRA representation at every rodeo. If you cannot attend a rodeo, try to find someone who can attend as Alternate Trustee. Brief him/her on their duties, and the Monday prior to the rodeo, send an email to the IGRA Board yahoo group, informing the BOD of the Alternate's name and which rodeo s/he will be attending.
- Ensure that the Rodeo Additional Insured request is sent to the IGRA Administrative Assistant at least 30 days prior to rodeo.
- Ensure that the IGRA Rodeo Settlement Sheet is completed and returned to the IGRA Treasurer no later than 30 days after rodeo.
- Act as team leader for NGRA at the annual IGRA Convention. Help solicit delegates and alternates. Discuss proposed IGRA Bylaw, Standing Rule and Rodeo Rule changes with NGRA BOD.
- Take nominations for International Awards to the third IGRA BOD Meeting.
- Complete IGRA Membership Renewal application and send it to the IGRA Secretary no later than 60 days prior to Convention.
- Solicit IGRA Convention Delegates and complete Delegate Registration forms.
- Submit NGRA's Appreciation Award selections to the IGRA Secretary before the announced due date (usually October 1).
- In the event NGRA has IGRA Royalty contestants, the Trustee will sign-off on the contest application.
- Sign-off on the upcoming year's Rodeo Application and submit it to the IGRA Secretary no later than seven days prior to Convention.

Potential candidates should be mindful of the significant commitment necessary in terms of availability for travel and of the expense of travel and lodging for the necessary meetings and rodeos. Please do not seek this position unless this is not an obstacle for you. The new Trustee should plan to attend this year's IGRA Convention in Reno, November 11-14 to learn the ropes and network.

David Hering has been selected by the NGRA Board as Chair for this Special Election. Please contact David for further information on candidacy for this position. I am also available to discuss the position in detail with anyone interested and of course will also be available if needed to support the transition. WORLD GAY RODEO FINALS UPDATE

Finals Rodeo preparation continued in June with a marathon series of meetings in Laughlin and Mojave Crossing on Friday, June 18. We met with the new General Manager of the Mojave Crossing Event Center where we reviewed the entire rodeo event to make sure we were in alignment. We had a very positive and productive meeting and even got some nice new benefits.

We also met with the AVI General Manager, F&B Director, Marketing Director, Catering and Special Events, and our Entertainment Director. We toured the facilities and met with the AVI tech people.

Following our meetings there, we headed over to the Lariat Saloon where we discussed details of our plans for the events that will take place at the location.

The IGRA Board and Finals Committee approved our selection of the Sin Sity Sisters Drug Assistance Program as our local beneficiary. The Mojave Crossing Indian tribe has asked that we also make a small donation to the Aha-Macav Boys and Girls Club in any amount. This organization provides important growth and development programs for tribal youth. I will consult with the Finals committee on that request.



Transportation is shaping up and I want to thank James Crawford for his work obtaining bids.

The schedule is gelling and we will be looking for volunteer drivers that weekend to do one or more runs. Please let James or myself know if you are interested.

The NGRA Finals production committee meets following the General Membership on the third Monday of each month at the Center. Please come get involved!





Howdy Fellow NGRA Members!

Your Mr. NGRA, JD Jensen, and I have had a busy month out representing NGRA and hosting fundraisers, both for NGRA and to meet our requirements to run for IGRA. We want to thank all of the NGRA members who come out to support our fundraisers twice a month - whether you buy a beer bust, a Jell-o shot, perform, or even just tip a dollar to a performer, you are helping raise money for NGRA and to put on BigHorn Rodeo 14.

JD and I were in a unique position earlier this year, since there is no rodeo in 2010. NGRA is as much a fundraising organization as it is a rodeo organization. Welcome readers! This is a new, and will be an ongoing, column for the NGRA BigHorn Gazette called, "Straight from the Horse's..." (mouth). This will be an interview with Cowboys & Cowgirls from across the IGRA Competitive Circuit. We will highlight certain events in rodeo monthly and talk to the riders and their animal counterparts for an in-depth exposé into the world of competing in an IGRA Sanctioned Rodeo. Please join me in welcoming FGRA's Cowboy Keith Huber!!



Joel: How long have you been involved in FGRA?

Keith: I joined FGRA (Florida Gay Rodeo Association) in 2006, when we had our inaugural rodeo - the Sunshine Stampede.

J: What events do/did you compete in?

K: My first year in rodeo I only competed in Camp Events, as most that start out in IGRA do. I competed in Goat Dressing, Steer Deco, and the Wild Drag Race at the Sunshine Stampede in 2006. I got my first ribbon at that rodeo and 3rd place in Wild Drag. I think that's what started the 'burn' to compete. The following year I went to Rodeo School in Phoenix to learn how to Steer Ride and Chute Dog. That is when the true rodeo addiction occurred.

J: What are your current rankings? Or, what was your ranking for your best year and which year was it?

K: My current rankings, per the IGRA.COM web site as of today, are: Chute Dogging #2, Calf Roping on Foot #11, Goat Dressing #23, Steer Deco #25, & Wild Drag #34.

J: Those are impressive number, Keith!

K: Thanks! I am most excited about the #2 ranking in Chute Dogging. These current rankings are my BEST ever! I am having a really good year so far. Last year, I competed in 12 rodeos on the IGRA circuit. This year I am trying to be a bit more focused and not do as many... I guess it's working

J: Have you ever buckled in any of these?

K: My FIRST buckle ever in a competition event was just a few weeks ago at the 2010 Sierra Stampede in Sacramento, CA. My 2nd buckle ever, came last weekend at the Greater International Motown Rodeo in Detroit, MI; it was for Goat Dressing.

J: Congrats on your first Buckle in Sacramento, I was there timing that weekend. Tell us about your steers and experience that weekend. K: Thank you. Wow! What an emotional high. I cried like a little baby when I heard Lewis, the announcer, say, " $\bar{\mbox{And}}$ the buckle winner in Chute Dogging this weekend is Keith Huber". The tears of excitement were flowing. I worked so hard that day. Some say it's the luck of the draw of the animal. I think it's a combination of both luck and skill. The animals that weekend were very difficult, truly ROUGH, rough stock. Mine was appropriately named "Steerzilla"... I was the only cowboy to dog my steer both days, thus winning the buckle. I could not have made it to this point without a lot of support from other cowboys, my rodeo partner Little Hoss, but especially Brian Helander, IGRA President. Steerzilla: Honestly, I don't understand that name. I am a gentle giant. A misunderstood, 2-ton baby. How would you feel is a cowboy grabbed you by the horns? I mean, hello? I know what I am doing. This ain't my first time at the rodeo either!

 $\mbox{\footnotemanh{\mbox{\sf J}}\xspace}.$ Welcome, Steerzilla. Let's focus on Chute Dogging for the remainder of the interview...

What kind of temperament does the rough stock animal usually have? K: Every animal is different, but let me tell you that feeling in your gut each time you get down in the chute next to the animal is always the same. The thought that always goes thru my head is, "What the heck am I doing in here?" But then the adrenaline kicks in. The key about Chute Dogging is not being fearful of the animal, YOU must be confident, show you're in charge and to use the words of my coach and mentor, Brian Helander, you must be focused on what you are doing. When you complete the event, if you can not recall everything you did from chute gate opening to the animal or you being on the ground, then you were

S: Again, what's with the bad rap? I love it when I can smell the fear. It reminds me of the pastures at home.

J: What is your best time?

K: My best time in Chute Dogging was actually at IGRA World Finals last year, 3.85 seconds. It was an exhilarating moment... the fastest 3 seconds of my life. I ended in $5^{\rm th}$ place with that time. World Finals is

the best of the best and it calls for each cowboy to do their best. S: Only Cowboy Keith was able to "dog" me. I stand proud that I am still a 98% Chute Doggin' Top! But, Cowboy Keith is a hot cowboy, so I happily had four helium heels for him.

J: What got you interested in Chute Dogging?

K: When I attended the Sunshine Stampede in Ft. Lauderdale in 2006, I only competed in the Camp Events, but after watching the rodeo the whole day, I got the desire to compete in other events. I also learned that in order to be an AII-Around Cowboy, you must compete in a Roping Event, a Rough Stock Event (like Chute Dogging), and a Camp Event. It was at that time my addiction to rodeo began.

S: I like the intensity with which Chute Doggers approach it. Each is different. My favorite reason is planting my hooves into the dirt and seeing them struggle to move my 2-ton ass any which way they can. Hilarious!

J: What do you think is the most difficult element?

K: I think the most difficult element is the unpredictability of the animals. You could get the same steer in the chute that a previous competitor just attempted to dog and it may or may not do the same thing. So, definitely the unpredictability of the animals is the most difficult element.

J: How do you practice for this event? It's not like speed events I am sure. What's your regimen?

K: I'm a City Boy and a Weekend Warrior Rodeo Cowboy, so it is kind of hard to practice for Chute Dogging. If and when a rodeo association offers a Rodeo School, I do my best to make it there so that I can get some practice in. Otherwise, it is knowing your technique, running through it prior to the event: stretching, putting on the safety gear, vest, mouth guard, gloves. Safety is very important! I've had a couple injuries in chute dogging, so safety is a big issue in the preparation.

S: Practice? What practice? I am a primadonna and will move and fall when I want to.

J: What is the most difficult element? Is it the fall, a "good dog," or holding on?

K: I think one of the most challenging animals to dog, is a runner. Although, you want a runner to get that animal out to that 10ft line quickly, but it's the keeping your feet and balance in front of the animal, so that you're not dogged. You want to PTD... Plant your feet, Turn your animal, and then, Dog'em.

J: Have you ever hit the proverbial wall?

K: LOL, oh yes, every Sunday after a rodeo after looking at my body and wondering where and how I got all the bruises all over my body. But then my rodeo partner and I start talking the fun we had and start talking about what rodeo we're doing next. S: Only when the gates weren't opened for me to pass through and I was still a little dizzy from the event. But it happened only once in my career.

J: Any remaining battle-wounds or are they all psychological? K: Oh geeze, where do I begin? In my 2nd and 3nd year of rodeo, I fractured 4 ribs and dislocated my shoulder all steer riding. Then I decided I'd wrestle them instead of ride them. But again, it's the staying focused on what you are doing when Chute Dogging. I've had 2 other injuries from being stepped on by steers, suffering 2 really bad contusions.

S: Ha, ha, ha! I had no idea this was a comedy interview.

J: OUCH! Ever get fined for a dropped F-Bomb, lost hat, etc.? K: Last year was a tough year, I was penalized a couple of times in Chute Dogging due to some rule changes that made it both challenging for the competitors and judges to judge the event. These rules have since been removed from the rule book.

- K: I'd have to say my favorite IGRA competitor would definitely be my mentor, Brian Helander. I truly feel I wouldn't be where I am today if it wasn't from the coaching and support of Brian. Non-IGRA... I guess Ty Murray, bull rider, loved his Ultimate Cowboy Show and hey he's married to Jewel, that lucky girl.

- S: Always respect your animal counterpart. And never do any events without the proper gear and safety preparations. It's all in sport and fun, we don't really want to hurt anyone.
